Special Thanks to Dr. Ernst Edlhauser

We wish to express our gratitude for a generous bequest from the estate of Dr. Ernst Edlhauser, the original Executive Director of Goethe House of Wisconsin, who passed away on December 5th, 2013, at the age of 88. He was born on February 1st, 1925 in Vienna, Austria. In 1957, he came to Milwaukee with his wife, the late June Edlhauser (Helgason).

Dr. Edlhauser served as the long-time director of Goethe House Wisconsin, from 1959 until 1995. Previously he had worked for the U.S. Embassy in Vienna and the Atomic Energy Agency of the United Nations. He was the recipient of awards (Order of Merit, First Class) by both the Austrian and West German governments, recognizing his services for the advancement of German language and culture.

On January 24th, 1961 the Goethe House opened to the public, and for over three decades thousands of visitors met Dr. Edlhauser as the face of Goethe House. The DSSV appreciates Dr. Edlhauser's extensive contribution to the study of the German language by Wisconsin students and adults.

In Commemoration of Wilma Giese

Wilma M. Giese was a former secretary and board member of the DSSV. She immigrated to Wisconsin from Germany in 1950, moved to Milwaukee in 1957 and was deeply involved in Milwaukee's German-American clubs and societies until the time of her death in May, 2021. She was an early board member of German Fest and chaired its cultural committee. The German government awarded her its Order of Merit in 1984. In 2000 she was named World Citizen of the Year by the International Institute. She made yearly special donations to the DSSV scholarship fund. We thank her family for this year's \$1,000 Memorial gift.

In Appreciation of Mark Haberberger

Mark Haberberger was a great supporter of the DSSV Essay Contest and German Career Day who sadly passed away on January 4, 2020. Mark was our keynote speaker at the 2018 DSSV Award Ceremony and represented GE Healthcare at the 2018 DSSV German Language Career Day. Mark was an active member of the greater Milwaukee German American community and the German American Chamber of Commerce.

Mark graduated from Pius XI High School in 1977 and from Marquette University, Milwaukee, WI in 1981, Suma Cum Laude, with a Political Science major and double minor in German and History. In 1985 Mark graduated from Cornell University Law School and for the past 20 years had a distinguished legal career as Senior Counsel at GE Healthcare, Wauwatosa, Wisconsin.

Mark was an avid genealogist and traveled to many parts of Germany, but his heart was always in Bavaria. As an avid German family historian, Mark made many visits to Germany following his first trip to his family home in Gunzendorf, Bavaria as a child in 1970.

We sincerely appreciate that in 2023, Linda again made a scholarship donation in Mark's name.

In Commemoration of Ingeborg Magyar July 11, 1927 – February 13, 2020

Ingeborg Schweinsberg Magyar immigrated to Milwaukee, Wisconsin from Hamburg, Germany in 1959. Inge was committed to the German community in her adoptive home where she met and married her husband Julius and raised their three children.

She was an active member of DANK for over 50 years, serving on the board for many of those years, singing in the Damenchor and dancing in the Tanzgruppe. She was actively involved in German Fest from the year of its inception, managing the South Gate Entrance for over 25 years. She was a proud German who loved speaking German with anyone who could and sharing stories from her long and interesting life here in the US and from her homeland of Germany. German Language Contest Description and Awards

AATG National German Exam and Awards

Each year, German students from Wisconsin high schools are eligible to participate in the National German Exam of the American Association of Teachers of German (AATG). This evaluation is administered at high schools throughout Wisconsin by the German teachers at their schools. The Level 2 test is taken by students who have two years of high school German. The Level 3 test requires three years of study, and Level 4 requires 4 or more years of study.

The Wisconsin AATG awards medals to participants with award winning scores and also invites students achieving the highest test scores to submit applications for study trips to Germany. Students must register for and participate in a personal interview in order to be nominated as a trip winner.

In 2023, five finalists were nominated for **AATG/PAD National German Exam Scholarships** and two scholarships were offered to Wisconsin students by the Pâdagogischer Austauschdienst in conjunction with the American Association of Teachers of German.

DSSV Essay Contest and Awards

Students taking the AATG exam are eligible to participate in the **DSSV German Essay contest.** The essays written by these students are evaluated by a selection committee including a final evaluation by a German Department faculty member from UWM.

The DSSV sponsors over one hundred fifty cash awards annually for students with excellent performance on the DSSV Essay and AATG National German Exam, and provides stipends to assist winners of AATG trip awards with incidental expenses incurred on AATG study trips.

Students who have taken the AATG test and have written a DSSV essay are eligible for the larger cash awards provided by the DSSV.

Karin Awve – Special Teacher Recognition Award

Karin is a 1984 graduate of Wauwatosa East HS where she was a recipient of DSSV Study Trip to Germany. She graduated from UW-Madison in 1988, having participated in their Year Abroad in Freiburg, Germany.

Karin received her Teacher Certification and Masters in Curriculum & Instruction from UWM and spent spring and summer of 1991 Student Teaching English as a Second Language in Freiburg, Germany through UWM.

As a Wauwatosa German teacher from 1992 to the present, she has been German Club Advisor, German Natl. Honor Society Advisor, GAPP German Exchange Co-Coordinator - taking Tosa students to Fulda, Germany and hosting German guests, and taking 8th grade students on a German Immersion Weekend at the Concordia Language Villages/Waldsee for 25 years.

We should note that not only was she herself a study trip winner, but as a teacher, she has had several grand prize and study trip winners in the DSSV/AATG contests. Past honors include the Distinguished Service Award, for which Karin was nominated by colleagues, students and parents, the Ambassador Award in recognition of professional service and dedication to Village Weekends, the Duden Award for excellence in teaching German, and the DANK Honorarium.

Karin's students have participated in the UW- Madison German Day Language Competition, WI State Speaking Contest, AATG National German Exam, DSSV Essay Contest, DSSV Career and College Day, TW Multi-Cultural Fair, and workshops and concerts through the Goethe Institut Chicago, and visit for Juniors to UW-Madison where they learn about opportunities including how they can pair German with another major and how to make German work for them in the future.

Der Aufsatz (2022 - 2023 Essay Topic)

This year's students were asked to write an essay in the German language on the theme "Schreibe in dein Tagebuch. Beschreibe einen perfekten Tag oder ein perfecktes Wochenende" Students were asked to describe a perfect day or a perfect weekend.

In the 2022 – 2023 school year, 364 essays from 17 high schools throughout Wisconsin were submitted. The top essays were evaluated and ranked by Dr. Jonathan Wipplinger of the University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee. In November 2022, the DSSV hosted its 4th **German Language Study Career Fair** for German language students in Wisconsin.

German companies that hire candidates with proficiency in the German language were present to meet with and advise high school and college students about working for a global enterprise. Colleges and universities offering German programs and study abroad programs were also represented.

There were presentations by and video interviews with college graduates who are now utilizing their knowledge of German to pursue careers in business, science, engineering, and the arts gave students insights into how their German language education can be applied to a successful career.

A current example of the growing career opportunities that exist with companies doing business in both the US and Germany is this recent announcement by Intel as reported in the New York Times:

New Chips Plant in Germany

As of January, 2023, Intel indicated that it was still committed to building the microchip manufacturing complex in Magdeburg, Germany.

Just last month, Intel also announced plans for a 1 billion dollar data center in Racine, Wisconsin.



Why Study German?

German is the official language in seven countries of the European Union: Germany, Austria, some regions of Switzerland and Belgium, Luxembourg, Liechtenstein and Italy (Südtirol). It is the second most popular language to learn in the EU and ranks among the top 10 most frequently languages spoken in the world. German plays an important role as a foreign language in many countries as in 2010 more than 14 million people worldwide learned German.



Travel: Millions of foreign tourists visit German-speaking countries every year. They want to see and experience King Ludwig's castles in Bavaria, the Austrian and Swiss Alps, German beer at the Oktoberfest or the stunning Rhine river. Speaking and understanding German will give you a chance to get to know Germans, their culture and their history at first hand. Germans are the most traveled people in the world – therefore, knowledge of German will also give you a great advantage with employment in the travel, hospitality or airline industry.

Increase your opportunities in the global economy: Germany has the largest economy in the European Union and the fourth largest in the world. Germany is home to numerous international corporations and most multinational German companies are represented in the United States.

Get to know a great European culture: German is a leading language of science, literature, philosophy, theology, history, music, film and art. Becoming acquainted with artists, composers, scientists, great thinkers and their contributions is very rewarding if done in their language. German is, for example, the language of Goethe, Kafka, Kant, Hegel, Nietzsche, Mozart, Beethoven, Luther, Marx, Freud and Einstein. Almost 80,000 new books are published in Germany each year (18% of worldwide publishing) making Germany the third largest publisher of books in the world after the USA and Japan.

Study in Germany: The German education system has a long tradition (the oldest German university, Ruprecht-Karls-Universität in Heidelberg, was founded in 1386) and a good international reputation. Germany has been one of the most important destination countries for international students, with nearly 250,000 students from abroad studying in Germany each year—over 10 percent of the total student population. In the new research undertaken by the British Council which examined the countries' three categories of higher education: openness; access and equity; quality assurance and degree recognition, Germany came in the first place.
